We are excited to be auditioning for the Shakespeare production this week. We would like to remind parents that children should bring their P.E. kits **and** musical instruments in **every** Tuesday.

Maths: This week the children will be learning how to round numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. They will be rounding 7 digit numbers. We teach them a short rhyme to help them remember:

Look at the column. Go next door. Round it up if, it is more than four.

It is important that the children know that if you round the number down, it stays the same and put zeros in the columns to the right. Please ask you children about rounding this week.

Writing:

We continue our focus on using accurate punctuation by exploring question marks, exclamation marks and commas. We will also focus on using conjunctions to make compound sentences.

Reading:
