
#### Nelson Mandela Year 6: Amon


Amon has shown a great attitude towards his learning in both reading and English. He has been independent, shown he is ready in every lesson and worked well with others.

Here is some excellent and neat Maths work from Seb (IN) and Naeemah (MF), adding tens across hundreds!







#### Year 2
