
Nelson Mandela Year 6: Mahir

Tip of the week: Helping Children Think and Talk

Sometimes, children who need more time to think can feel a bit lost in busy places. As parents, we can support them by giving them time to talk. Just wait patiently for their answers, encourage them to share their thoughts, and let others know we're waiting for our child to speak because they probably have something interesting to say.

For example, if your child is taking a moment to answer a question, you can patiently wait and say, "Let's give them a moment. I'm sure they have something interesting to share." This helps them feel more comfortable expressing their thoughts.

We have been busy getting all festive by making our christmas cards and our decorations.



In nursery classes, children learn a Makaton sign weekly. Here is an example:



To say hello, move your hand from one side to the other once at shoulder height.

In reception, the children learnt about some people and countries that celebrate Christmas and wrote some cvc words related to Christmas using their phonics knowledge.
