Dear parents and carers,

Another week has flown by at Duncombe Primary School. The children have been enjoying the beautiful autumn weather in outdoor PE sessions, including the introduction of tag rugby. Year 6 (EP) class spent the week taking part in the Into University project. The school has a long-standing partnership with Into University and the week consists of activities which help raise pupils' aspirations and give them the opportunity to see what life at a university might be like. Winston Churchill Year 6: Nada

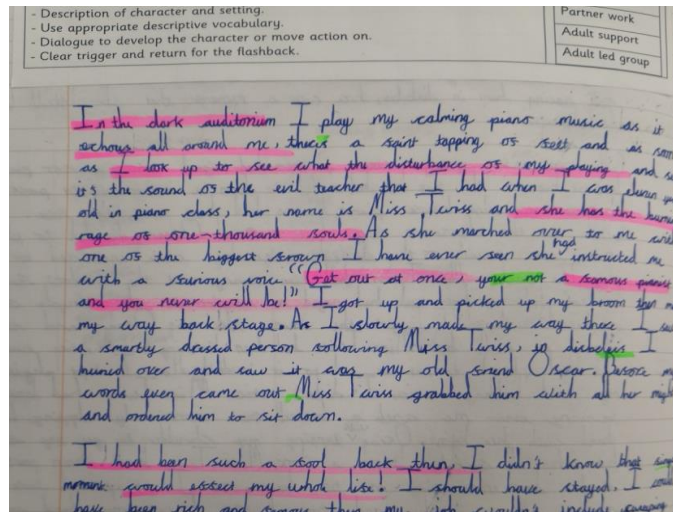

Mya listened really well during our maths measurement lesson and when the work became particularly hard, she persevered and scored 100% in the task.

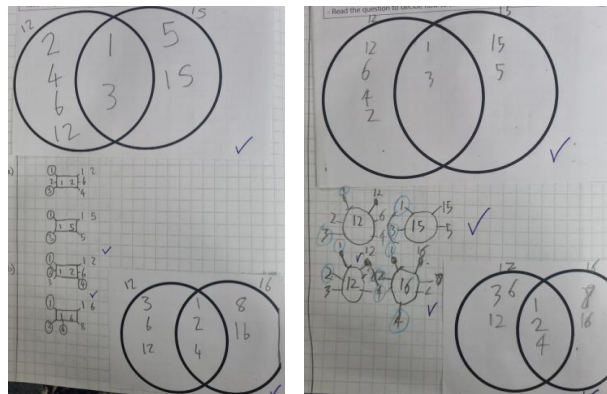

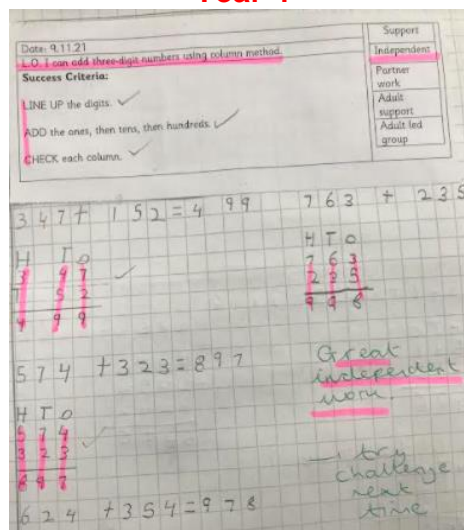
Some descriptive writing which explored a character's feelings after a flashback
