



## Year 3 Weekly update: Week 3

### Messages:

Well done to the children and parents who have remembered to wear their Duncombe P.E kit on Mondays and Thursdays.

Remember that the maths homework is Mathletics on the computer.

### Maths:

In Maths, we will be learning about place value. We will be looking at 3 digit numbers and how to add and subtract 1 more/less, 10 more/less and 100 more/less. Please practise at home. Ask a question once a day to support your child. We have also been revising odd and even numbers.

### Phonics / Spellings:

The children have been practising the year 3 spelling words.

We are going to look at contractions over the next week. They will have homework to practise this with you.

Some of our children are continuing with their phonics. If your child is in a phonics class, it is especially important to make sure you read their special phonics book with them every night.

### English:

The children have been looking at our exciting story book Traction Man. We've been looking at verbs and this week we will be retelling the story, before we move on some exciting story writing of our own!

We're focusing on writing full sentences, with capital letters and full stops, so please praise your children whenever you see them doing it!

### Topic:

In Topic, are going to revise the 7 continents and will be looking at a map of the world. They will use a key to label the map.

The children will also be taking part in a cooking class. We will be making our own spring rolls.

### Homework:

The children have been given their homework grid. This has a science activity and topic activity. The children must do at least one of the activities for topic each week. Maths homework is done with Mathletics. All the children have their log in details in their Reading Diaries.

Spellings must be practised. The children will have a spelling test every Tuesday on the spellings they have been given for homework. Not all the children will have the same spelling homework.

Homework is very important. It reflects what we are learning in class. If your children do their homework, then they will have the tools they need to succeed in class and enjoy lessons more confidently.
