# English

This term we will be looking at a variety of different text types, including: **The Owl and the Pussycat, The Frog Princess** and **Dave and the Tooth Fairy**. We will be using talk for writing throughout all of our stories to help the children develop their understanding of stories and widen their vocabulary. This half term we will be focussing on developing the children's sentences with conjunctions.

## **Phonics**

The children will continue with their phonics groups which will help them progress with their reading skills. We aim for the children to become confident readers. Please encourage book talk at home with your child as this will help them to become fluent readers. We hope the children begin to develop a love for reading.

## Maths

This half term we will be continuing to focus on addition and subtraction. The children will begin to learn formal methods to assist with their calculations of two 2-digit numbers. It is important that children continue to practice counting in 2s, 5s, 10s and 3s whilst also being able to count to 100 from any given number. Towards the end of the half term the children will explore money, they will be able to count money, show equal amount of money and also compare different coins.

#### Science

This half term we will be learning about **Use of Everyday Materials**. The children will learn to identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials, including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for particular uses. The children will also use a range of sorting activities and be encouraged to use scientific vocabulary.

# P.E.

P.E. lessons will take place on a <u>Thursday</u> afternoon. Children must bring in their P.E. kits each week to get changed. In P.E. lessons, children will learn to run at fast, medium and slow speeds and how to change speed and direction. The children will also take part in the Daily Mile, this will involve running several laps around the playground to improve the children's fitness, stamina and energy levels in class.

# History

This half term we are continuing to learn about **Kings and Queens**, but specifically, Kings and Queens of the U.K. Children will learn about Queen Elizabeth I and the important role she had in building economic prosperity and successes for England. They will have the chance to look at 'The Armada Portrait' and discuss how it presents Queen Elizabeth I's achievements. Building on this, they will compare her reign to Queen Victoria, the longest serving monarch of Great Britain.

### R.E.

In R.E. this half term, children will be considering the question: **Who is a Muslim and what do they believe?** In R.E. lessons, children will discover what Muslims believe about God/Allah and how this is demonstrated. They will then explore leaders and recognise that leaders set a good example. They will discuss how the Prophet is a leader of Muslims, who follow his teachings.

#### Music

Children will have music lessons on a Thursday. This half term they will begin to learn the recorder. This should be brought in each week.

#### Homework

Homework will be sent home once a week on Friday's. This will include spellings to learn and a Doodle Maths activity. Children should be reading for at least 20 minutes every day and returning their reading diaries daily.
